Analyze errors to determine possible auditory discrimination difficulties.

Common errors: /s/ vs. /sh/, /m/ vs /n/, /ch/ vs. /j/, /b/ vs. /d/, /f/ vs. /th/, etc.

*Don't confuse auditory discrimination with auditory memory (the ability to remember sound sequences long enough to work with them.)
