


How Does Silver Moon Work?

Silver Moon teaches reliable spelling rules (phonics patterns) that are paired with easy to use lesson plans and collectible rule cards. Teachers teach lessons and students are awarded a card after each mastered lesson. Each card contains a mnemonic based name, a fun image, and hidden picture clues. Silver Moon collectible cards are motivating, engaging and create important memory triggers to aid retention of material.

Spelling rules are **clearly defined** on the back of each card and are used as a student resource for activities, games and to promote independent application of material. Visual, auditory, and kinesthetic modalities are used when spelling.

What's included in the instructor's manuals?



Tips & Tricks are found throughout all Silver Moon instructor's manuals and are helpful when differentiating content to meet diverse student needs.



Step C and D

It's helpful for students to add movement to the "stretch it out" step *while* they simultaneously say the word slowly. You should add the same movement when you are saying the word slowly. Try one of these ideas.

1. Make a slow "swoosh" by moving your hand across the table slowly from left to right (in the shape of a shallow bowl). 2. Slide your hand down and across your left arm until the last sound reaches your wrist. This reinforces the necessity to say the word slowly. The movement and speech should be slow and simultaneous.

TIPS & TRICKS

If the students continue to hear one sound, have them listen closely while you slowly say /ks/ again. Ask them to count the sounds they hear on their fingers. If this doesn't work, say /ks/ and show them how you count the sounds on your fingers. Raise one finger while you say the /k/ sound and a second finger for the /s/ sound. Your fingers should be raised in left to right fashion using the same directionality as reading. Now, have them do it with you. Next, have them do this alone. Finally, ask again how many sounds X makes. Now they should have the correct answer.
